Pastor Kent

"If I speak in the tongues of men and of angels, but have not love, I am a noisy gong or a clanging cymbal. And if I have prophetic powers, and understand all mysteries and all knowledge, and if I have all faith, so as to remove mountains, but have not love, I am nothing. If I give away all I have, and if I deliver up my body to be burned, but have not love, I gain nothing."

(1 Corinthians 13:1-3 ESV)

Although we recognize that God has given to each of us gifts and talents, we often fail to use them in his service. We sit back and receive the service of others, who use their God-given gifts to bless us. But we are unwilling to serve and bless others with the gifts entrusted to us.

Yet, even when we do use them, our motives are often wrong. And, because they are wrong, we end up serving with a wrong spirit. Our service is motivated by our sinful nature.

We often serve God and one another out of a sense of guilt. We often serve God and one another out of a sense of duty. We sometimes serve God and one other in an effort to make a name for ourselves. And we sometimes serve in an effort to curry the favor of God and man.

However, as Paul tells us in the above passage, our gifts mean nothing and accomplish nothing if they are not used in a spirit of love. And, as is characteristic in Scripture, the love to which we are called in an unconditional love. The love to which we are called is a sacrificial love.

If our gifts are used apart from this love, we are only making noise. If our gifts give us great abilities, and we are without this love, we are nothing. And if we sacrifice ourselves completely, but do so without this love, we gain nothing.

God has certainly granted us these abilities and called on us to use them. But the underlying

motive in their use must be love. We must serve out of our love for God, and out of love for our neighbor. We must unconditionally and sacrificially give of ourselves that we might accomplish God's purpose and that we might be a blessing to those around us.

Because we are sinful creatures, we will naturally struggle with selfishness and impure motives. This is an ongoing battle. And, for this reason, we must always search our heart to evaluate our motives. We must always ask God to search us and reveal to us any impurity that's directing our actions.

When it's found that we are acting out of anything other than love, we must repent. We must look to Christ, in faith, seeking God's mercy. And we must ask him to fill our heart with his love, that it might overflow into the lives of others. We must ask him to fill us with love so that, in our service, we might seek only to glorify him and bless those in our path.

Wednesday Bible study – We'll finish our study on Mormonism on January 23rd. This will leave two weeks before we start Lent. We are considering having a short study on Jehovah's Witness structure for those two weeks.

In February we will find out if and who we may get as a Pastoral intern for next year. There are five potential interns available.

Trustee's Report – Joe Barbot

Stuff – Discussed bringing down items we don't need anymore from the upstairs storage rooms to see if anyone in the congregation wants any of it. (i.e. water fountain, wood valances). Council encouraged trustees to do this soon. Margie Lee suggested that we put everything out for a bid to raise money for missions, etc.

Furnaces - Replacement furnace for the roof units for all units and attic unit. Les is getting bids from Advanced Mechanical and HA Thompson and Sons. He is trying to get a 3rd bid. Riley Schriefer suggested Dakota Heating and Air. Joe Barbot suggested Duke Hammerschmidt also. Del Schnaidt mentioned Clay's Plumbing and Heating.

Snow Removal – Jim Schumaier and Shane Haugen have tractors and will take care of parking lots. Only a few people signed up to shovel

State Health Inspection – Our north door has a gap so we got a citation for that. Other than that, we passed the inspection for licensing our kitchen.

Christian Ed Report – Michelle Klaudt

Christian Ed doesn't meet in December so they didn't have a formal meeting. Angie Wanzek has stepped back in her duties since her son has been diagnosed with leukemia.

Chris Alt and Garrett Placke are doing Wednesday Night High School Bible Study. Garrett Placke and Gina Fiest are doing Middle School Bible study. Chery Gegelman will do Sunday School for a month or two.

OLD BUSINESS

Organists - Margie Lee has a simple form for organists to fill out if they want to be paid for playing for church services.

NEW BUSINESS

Fellowship Room Decorations - Darcee Wenning donated 30 white round table linens and 5 white rectangle table linens to the church after her daughter's wedding. We approved via email purchasing from Amy Haugen for \$300 – 30 white

rectangle table linens, 2 white table skirts and 260 white chair covers.

Custodian – We discussed some issues our current custodian has been having and we may need to look for a replacement. We raised the salary to \$20 per hour. Joe Barbot will taking care of this.

AFLC Annual Conference – Approved giving \$200 to help with the cost of the VBS team at the Annual Conference in Dickinson this June.

Church Insurance Policy –Randy Schneider and Del Schnaidt will meet with the American Family agent as he would like to review the policy with the church before renewal in March. Insurance coverage is approximately \$2.25 million.

Tithe – Our tithe of \$3,156.06 will be given to AFLC Home Missions
