"Therefore do not be ashamed of the testimony about our Lord, nor of me his prisoner, but share in suffering for the gospel by the power of God, who saved us and called us to a holy calling, not because of our works but because of his own purpose and grace, which he gave us in Christ Jesus before the ages began..."

(2 Timothy 1:8-9 ESV)

Many of us, in the church, do not talk about our faith outside of church. It's something that we keep to ourselves. And the reason we do so is because we're ashamed.

Even though we live in a nation that, over the course of history, has been predominately Christian, this is no longer the case. Even if a majority of Americans continue to classify themselves as "Christian," they do not hold to Christian beliefs and practices. They, instead, follow the opinions of man. They, instead, live to gratify their sinful desires.

We certainly feel this in our day to day lives. We feel it as we listen to people talk. We feel it as we watch how people live. It is clear to us that a Biblical mindset, that a Biblical faith, is frowned upon.

We then fear that, if we are open about our faith, we will suffer the consequences. We fear that we may be disliked. We fear that we may be ridiculed. We fear that we might experience hatred and persecution.

I'm saddened as I think about the many times I've been ashamed of the gospel. I'm saddened as I think of the many ways this shame has been demonstrated in my life. It's something that characterized my younger years and that occasionally raises its ugly head even today.

I hate to think of this because, after all, this is the God who saved us. This is the God who, in spite of our guilt, rescued us from death and hell. This is the God who sent his Son into the world, that he might pay the penalty of our sin.

This is also the God who called us to a holy calling. This is the God who called us to be his people. This is the God who called us to proclaim the gospel to the whole creation. This is the God who called us to make disciples of all nations.

Knowing his love and salvation, we're to willingly share in suffering for the gospel. We're to live out our faith and carry out our calling no matter what it means for us. We're to do so knowing that our salvation is a certainty, and that it can't be taken by man.

We do this not by our own strength. This is done only by the power of God. It's he who enables us to stand firm in faith. It's he who enables us to continue in our calling even in the face of difficulty.

We will be on Lesson 9, "SOLD-OUT HOPE: Total Surrender to Jesus", in our WMF Bible study which will meet on Monday, October 15 at 10:30 and 6:30. "Then Jesus told His disciples, 'If anyone would come after Me, let him deny himself and take up his cross and follow me. For whoever would save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake will find it.'" Matthew 16:24-25

Our last lesson focused on where we need to go to maintain our hope as we go through faith-testing circumstances. Rights and wrongs

As the school year has kicked off as well as youth groups and Sunday school, it seems like someone just pushed the gas pedal all the way down and didn't wait to ask, "Did you have your seatbelt on?" But as always, the most exhausting things in life tend to be the ones with the most blessing hidden behind the curtain.

And one of those blessings was during high school youth group. About 20 minutes into the lesson we were varying pretty far from the lesson. The lesson was about adam and eve and their sin and what that means for us today and how sin hasn't changed for us even now. But this conversation quickly got to the topic of morality. We started talking about how rights and wrongs work in the world and the biblical evidence for such things. And that's all I've really been thinking about since.

So the question is, are there objective rights and wrongs in the world (basically meaning, are there absolute rights and wrongs to everyone), and if so or not, why does it matter?

As far as objective rights and wrongs go, we (as Christians) need to be on the same page in this subject. If we are torn apart on this, then we as believers of Christ won't be able to defend Christ in this world where Christ is very much on trial. Especially when so many things that were once held sacred are now thrown to the curb in most social situations. We look at a world that once held family sacred, but now is so willing to say that divorce is a fine and even a good thing. And a world that once held life in the most important of places in our hearts, but now thinks that it is no longer immoral to abort a child. We as believers need to agree that these things and many others are held sacred and wrong and that there are in fact absolute rights and wrongs in this world that God says that we will be judged by when our time comes. But thanks to God he has laid a way out of these sins for us, and we find that hope in Jesus and his death. If we combine the theology of the absolute rights and wrongs in

this world and mix that with the Gospel and what God has done for us, then there will be no person that will be unwilling to turn to Christ because they know there sins, and they know how to be forgiven!

COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS

President's Report – Delton Schnaidt

First off, I say congratulations and thank you to Joette and Les Buchmann for heading up a successful “Feed My Starving Children” event this past month. Praise God for his never-failing provision in supplying what seemed to be a shortage of funding, and enough help to reach the goals that were set. I also congratulate and say thank you to the area ministerial, the local communities, those who travelled a long distance to help, and finally to all those who helped to make a difference, either financially or their hands-on contribution. Let it be known, the lives of many starving children around the world will be affected in a better way because of the sacrifices and commitment made for this event to succeed. May your efforts be blessed as you humbly help others who are in need.

Our HVAC replacement project is nearing completion. When I spoke with Samuel of Legend Aire, he estimated the project to be completed near the end of September or shortly after. In the meantime, the “propane fuel source for heat is isolated” until all the new furnaces are operational. This means we will need to rely on the electric cover heaters for a short time in the sanctuary for heat. The fellowship room, kitchen, and the warehouse furnaces are functional to heat by way of the heat pump systems in those areas.

Pastor's Report – Pastor Kent

Attended staff meetings, deacon's meeting, & Christian Ed meeting.

Participated in our ministerial prayer meetings, as well as our business meeting.

Led services at KRCC and Senior Suites. Communed residents at KRCC.

Conducted a couple of spiritual assessments for hospice.

I conducted the orientation meeting for confirmation, and held our first weeks of class. We have a total of 11 students this year, 7 of which are in their second year and will be confirmed in May.

Feed My Starving Children update – The Beulah Ministerial association is looking at having multiple churches hosting which has been the goal of FMSC all along. Joette Buchmann had this update:

Total volunteers (including set-up and clean-up) = 460

Packing volunteers (including labelers and warehouse group) = 424

Average number of volunteers/packing session = 141

Number of boxes filled = 504

Number of Manna Rice packs filled = 18,144

Number of meals packed = 108,864

Number of kids fed for a year = 297

Our goal for meals = 108,864 (reached)

Funding required = \$23,950.08 (exceeded)

Pounds of food delivered to food pantry = 169
