"In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. All things were made through him, and without him was not anything made that was made. In him was life, and the life was the light of men."

(John 1:1-4 ESV)

As we read this passage, we find that Christ is the source of life. Knowing the gospel, we understand that he's the source of eternal life. We understand that he's provided it for us by his death on the cross. And we understand that we receive salvation through faith in him. But we fail to realize that he's the source of our life in this world as well.

In the words of John, that we read above, this truth becomes apparent. We find that Jesus lived with God the Father in eternity. We find that, through

Jesus, all things were created. We find that nothing was made apart from him.

In Colossians 1:16-17 we learn that Jesus sustains all things. We learn that all things hold together because of Jesus. So, from all of this, we learn that Jesus gave us life in the beginning, that he sustains our life here and now, and that he provides for us the blessing of life everlasting.

Yet, the issue of life here in this world has grown complicated. It's not as simple as knowing that people are born and people die. We face a horde of issues that determine whether someone should live.

We face issues like abortion. But this is only one of many issues related to life. We face issues such as euthanasia and physician assisted suicide. We face issues like birth control and invitro fertilization. We face issues like genetic engineering and cloning. We face issues such as embryonic stem cell research.

Sunday School Corner

Many of these practices are accepted, being viewed as acts of mercy. We tell ourselves that it's not loving to bring a child into the world when he's not wanted. We tell ourselves that it's not loving to allow people to live when they'll have no quality of life. We tell ourselves that it's not loving to forbid a couple struggling with infertility to conceive when we have the technology to help them. We tell ourselves that it's not right to allow people to suffer when we can take cells from an embryo and use them to bring about a cure.

These are not easy issues. They are difficult, especially, when our emotions come into play. But we must look at them from the perspective of the giver of life. We must understand his role as well as our own.

I invite you to come to our spring spiritual life meetings, beginning April 15th, where we'll consider topics such as these. We'll have with us Pastor Don Richman, an AFLC pastor who serves on the board of Lutherans for Life. And he'll open God's Word with us on subjects such as these.

Chairman's Thoughts...

I'm sure you have most all heard it said - **"Christianity is only a generation away from extinction."**

I read an article, which was printed in 2013, and thought it would be interesting to paraphrase and share. This same situation could happen right here in America, and to be truthful, it probably already has headed in that direction. I'm certainly encouraged with the young families and the youth activities at our church. Praise God! Keep it going! The article I reference goes like this:

Article: Unless the church makes a substantial breakthrough in attracting young people back to the faith, Christianity in Britain is just "a generation away from extinction," says former Archbishop of Canterbury Lord Carey.

Referencing the Church of England's warning that shrinking attendance could challenge its role as a "national institution," Lord Carey pointed out at a Christian Conference that clergy are currently grappling with a "feeling of defeat" and congregations are weighed down with "heaviness." (*my opinion DS- treating the church as an institution could be part of the problem in England*)

On top of that, he said, the public's reaction to all of this is simply "rolled eyes and a yawn of boredom."

"In many parts of Britain churches are struggling, some priests are lacking confidence in one's own ability; a feeling of defeat is around. The burden seems heavy and joy in ministry has been replaced by a feeling of heaviness," said Lord Carey, highlighting that people had become dismissive toward the gospel.

"The viewpoint could be expressed in a variety of non-verbal ways: the shrug of indifference, the rolled eyes of embarrassment, the yawn of boredom...So many people do not see the average church as a place where great things happen," he said.

"One of the most worrying, most urgent groups we need to invest in is young people. We ought to be ashamed of ourselves," Lord Carey noted.

"So many churches have no ministry to young people and that means they have no interest in the future. As I have repeated many times in the past we are one generation away from extinction. We have to give convincing and clear reasons to young people why the Christian faith is relevant to them," he said.

With this in mind, please pray that God's hand would be over the entire situation, for our upcoming meetings on February 24th & 25th with Seth Larson, a candidate from the AFLC Bible School who is interested in the Youth Director position at Prince of Peace.

We should never forget, that even here in America, we too are only one generation away from Christianity being extinct.
